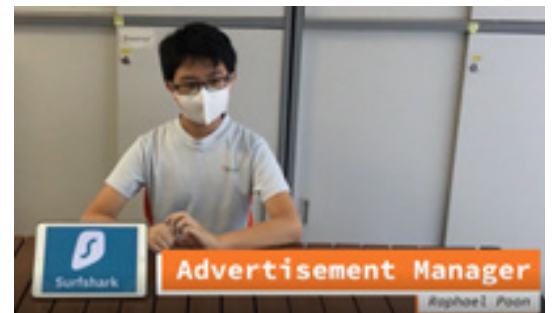
The students made podcast about "Students' Issues". They recorded the whole podcast, in which there was an advertisement segment and discussion of students' problems by experts.

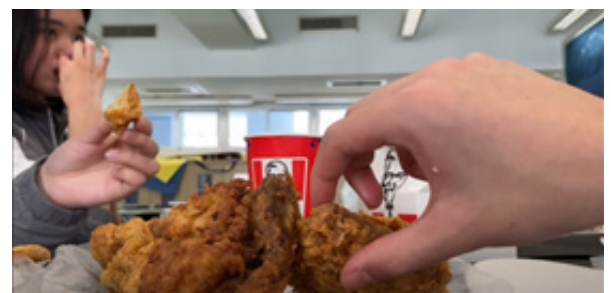

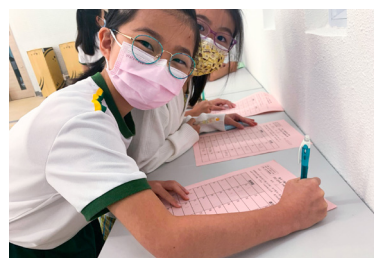
